

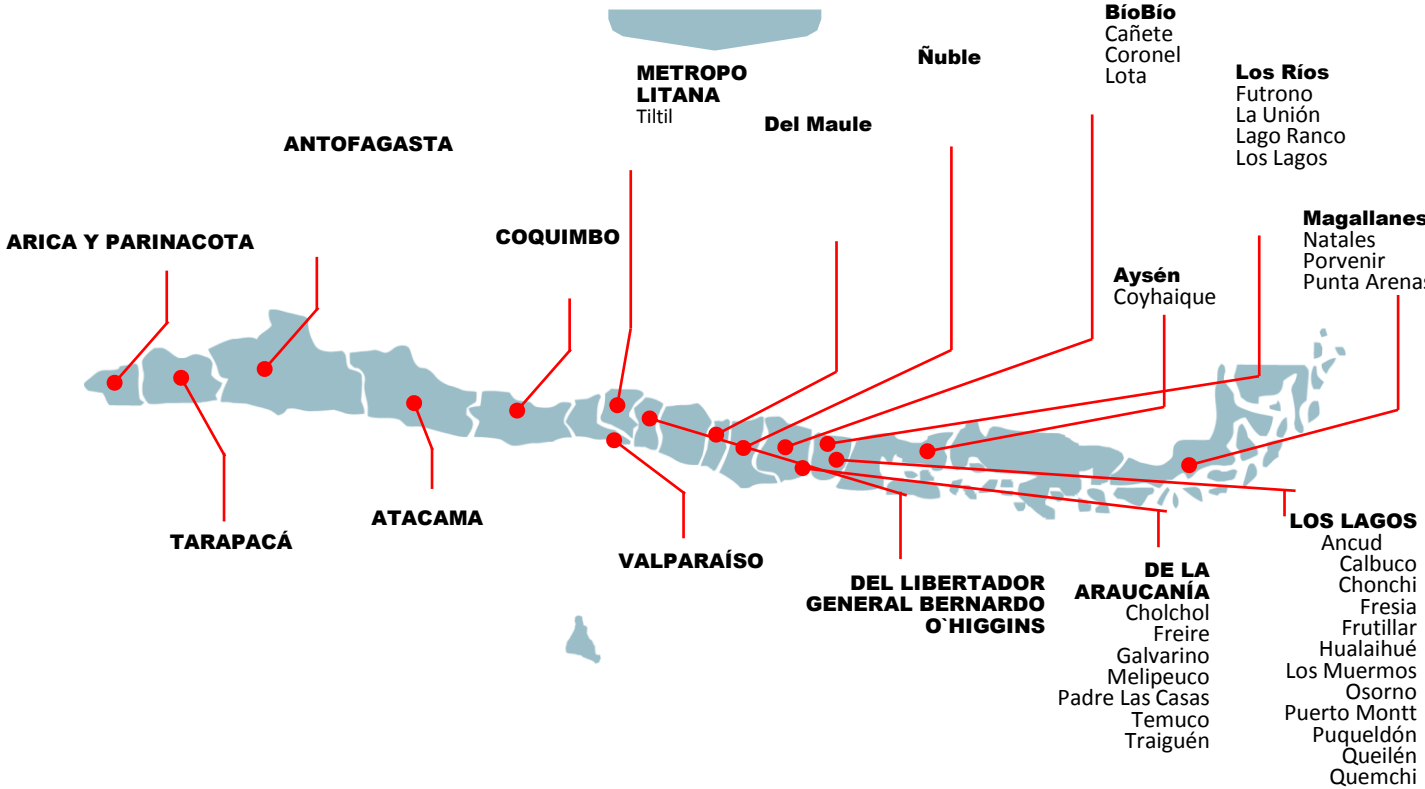

LATEST MEASURES



- As of November 23, interregional trips can be made only with a health passport. In this way, it will no longer be necessary to also have the interregional permit, but only the health passport for trips between communes in phase three onwards.
- The Undersecretary for Crime Prevention, Katherine Martorell, announced that for the next votes on November 29, people with COVID are not allowed to go to the polls.
- Starting at 00:00 hours this Monday, November 23, the borders of the Arturo Merino Benítez airport were opened for foreigners under a strict health protocol that requires: having a negative PCR no more than 72 hours before boarding, carrying insurance of COVID health, with a minimum coverage of 30 thousand dollars and a sworn statement with background.
- From November 23 to December 7, those who come from countries with community transmission declared by the WHO, will have to quarantine for 14 days.
- Health authorities visited the first patient undergoing liver transplantation at the Sótero del Río Hospital.
- The Ministry of Health made the 70th epidemiological report of COVID-19 and the 23rd Weekly Report of Deaths from COVID-19 available to the community.
- The Undersecretary for Crime Prevention, Katherine Martorell, announced that due to the increase in cases in Greater Concepción, it was decided to advance the start of the curfew to 8:00 p.m. from next Saturday, November 21.

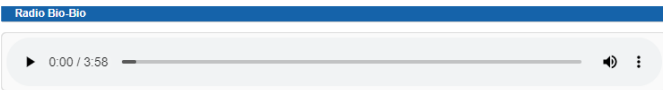

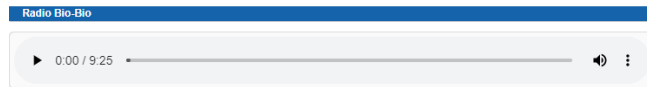

Seminario virtual analizará el impacto del Covid-19 en los pacientes con diabetes
La instancia es abierta al público y se transmitirá el miércoles 25 de noviembre a las 18:00 a través del canal de YouTube de la CIF, y contará con la participación del ministro de Salud, Enrique Paris.
Considerando antecedentes como la disminución del 73% de los ingresos de pacientes con diabetes al programa de salud cardiovascular y del 50% de los controles debido a la pandemia por Covid-19, la Alianza por un Chile sin Diabetes organizó el seminario virtual "Diabetes y COVID-19. La suma de dos pandemias" para este miércoles 25 a las 18:00 a través de emol.tv.
Este encuentro busca analizar cómo disminuir el impacto que ocasiona la suma de ambas pandemias, las estrategias para recuperar el diagnóstico y control de pacientes, y cómo enfrentar de manera coordinada esta pandemia de diabetes invisibilizada.
El evento contará con la participación del Ministro de Salud, Enrique Paris, y del embajador de Dinamarca en Chile, Jens Goolfredsen, quienes estarán a cargo de la apertura del seminario. Asimismo, Mirene Piacol, jefa del Departamento de Enfermedades Crónicas No Transmisibles del Minsal, y Patricio Salman, de la Sociedad Chilena de Endocrinología y Diabetes, realizarán una presentación sobre el impacto de la pandemia en los enfermos de diabetes.
Posteriormente, se abrirá un panel de discusión moderado por María Cristina Escobar, consultora en enfermedades no transmisibles de OPS, y que será integrado por Mirene Piacol, jefa del Departamento de Enfermedades Crónicas No Transmisibles del MINSAL, Marcela Rivera, médico familiar y profesor asistente de la Universidad de Chile, Marcelo González, fundador de la comunidad virtual MiDiabetes.cl y paciente con diabetes tipo 1, Alejandra Avela, directora de la Asociación Chilena de Enfermeros Educadores en Diabetes, Patricio Salman, de la Sociedad Chilena de Endocrinología y Diabetes, y Francisca Rodríguez, gerente de Investigación y Salud de la Cámara de la Innovación Farmacéutica (CIF).
